

**General Manager's Report # 250
Gary R. Phillips, May 19, 2011:**

Jen Bunce is doing a marvelous job at the very tedious task of rewriting every single one of our 2,189 lot numbers on the newest version of our RRA maps. The improvement is very dramatic compared to the older editions.

We created a plaque commemorating Ed Baitt's six years of service on the Board of Directors, but Ed elected to receive it privately and we had a picture taken at the office for the paper.

The RRA Boating rules were printed in the May newspaper and we ask that members familiarize themselves and any of their guests that may operate their watercraft with the lake rules.

The Concession Stand opens May 28th and we are going to experiment with longer hours during the holiday weekends. If growing business results are favorable, we might experiment once again with longer daily hours of service for the evenings.

The Annual RRA-RSV Clean-Up Day was a hit on May 7th. We supplied 18 dozen donuts and cookies, coffee, milk & juice for the participating membership and our terrific workers.

Collections have been going much better than expected as we have already matched our \$50,000 target budgeted for ALL of 2011. The lot sales component is off to a good start as we sold 13 lots at \$2,500. With costs, past taxes and some splits with the Village we realize very little cash at that price, but they also hold the promise of future income as well.

We are getting reports of lots of beaver and groundhog damage this rainy spring. We have contracted a local trapper and have the permission of the state wildlife officer and the Village to trap the animals. ANY MEMBERS WITNESSING OR SUFFERING DAMAGE FROM THESE ANIMALS ARE ASKED TO REPORT THESE INCIDENTS AND LOCATIONS TO THE RRA OFFICE RIGHT AWAY.

Since the beaver are out of season, we needed special permission from the game warden. He asks in return that our members to be proactive at discouraging them in the future.
